We invite two types of submissions:

- REGULAR PAPERS describe research not published or submitted elsewhere (10–12 pages).
- SHORT PAPERS may be position papers, description of research prospects, challenges, projects, ongoing works, or applications (5–9 pages).

We would be happy if you follow the simple rules:

1. The manuscript should not use page numbering.
2. The Title Should Use the Emphasizing Capitalized Style like This.
3. The authors' names should not be abbreviated. Use full first names.
4. The headings of any-level sections should be all use the regular style, not the Emphasizing Capitalized Style.

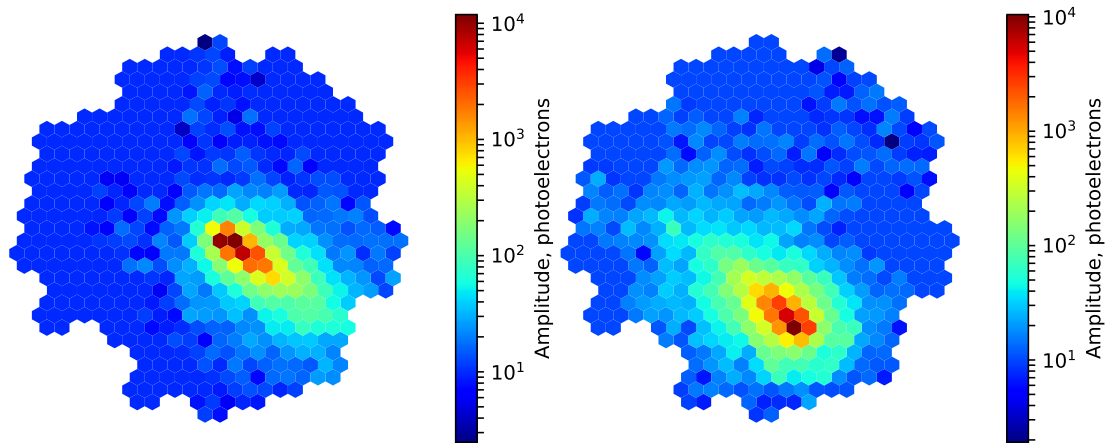


Figure 1: Example figure.

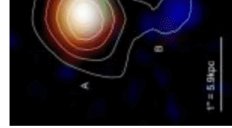
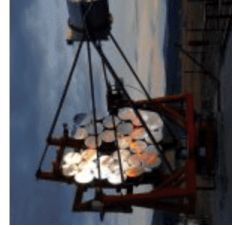
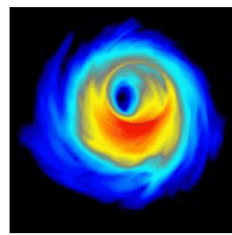
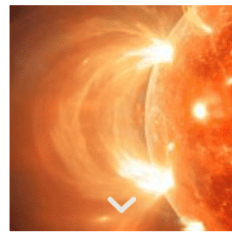
Start the appendix with the “`appendix`” command:
